The Youth Council is a group of young people from a diverse range of backgrounds, faiths, ages and genders, who are passionate about getting young people's voices heard. By engaging with the City Council and other service providers on issues important to the young people of the City, we strive to ensure that every young person can have a say in decisions that affect them.

support young people to get their voices heard



work on creative campaigns and projects through consultation, awareness raising, working with the local service provision etc



create sustainable projects which could be continued by local groups#



engage and encourage young people in participation activities



develop youth ambassadors and future leaders

Our priorities...



social and cultural scene – the lack of feeling safe, more youth participation, more youth facilities/activities



climate/environment – green spaces, recycling, tree planting



transport – buses, improved cycle routes, safer routes for walking and cycling

Becoming a Youth Councillor gives you the chance to make your mark. You will be able to air your views, meet other young people, and tell decision makers what should really be happening for young people in your area.

As a Youth Councillor you can...



represent and talk to local young people



meet local councillors and other decision-makers to talk about issues affecting young



be involved in events celebrating the work that you do and get involved in special



be involved with the process of electing new members and junior mayors

Youth Councillors are usually 11 - 19 who live, work or study in Hereford, but exceptions can be made (24 if you have a disability). Once you have applied, we will invite you to a meeting to see if you think it's for you.

experience of campaigns, consultations and conferences, involving communications and public speaking

friendships, links and networks

the opportunity to have your voice and the voices of others in your community heard

impact positive change

lots of fun including activities

the chance to find out more about your local community

shape future Youth Councils and guide new Youth Councillors

the opportunity to take on responsibilities (e.g. become Chair, Treasurer, Social Media Officer etc)

a reference for school/ college/ university/ employment

is committed, lively and outgoing

is able to listen to and respect the views of others but also speak their mind

can work as part of a team

is prepared to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours per month (outside of school/college/work hours)

takes their responsibilities seriously

asks for support, advice and help if needed

Help you can expect...

support and friendship from other youth councillors

experienced youth workers and council officers present at meetings and events

support from nominated City Councillors

a team who will help you get the most out of your experience

(Should a Youth Councillor at the age of 18 be elected as a Councillor to sit on Hereford City (Parish) Council or on the Unitary Authority Herefordshire Council, then they will cease to sit as a member on Hereford City Youth Council).
